TRAIL RIDE

Let's say you're 12 years old. Or 42. Or 72. Doesn't matter. It's a sunny Saturday morning. The chores, miraculously, are done, and you and your family have all day to do whatever you'd like. Does this sound great? Then put your bicycles on the back end of a train, ride the rails out to a beautiful trail and peddle around all day!

The Heber Valley Historic Railroad, Wasatch County Trails and the State of Utah have teamed up to turn this fantasy summer day into a reality. Craig Lacey, the executive director of the Heber Valley Railroad, said an added

caboose and baggage car are available to carry bicycles to three railroad stopping points that access the newly built Deer Creek Trail, the newest link in the Provo/Jordan River Parkway. The 7.5-mile, non-motorized trail connects Deer Creek Dam to Soldier Hollow. "This trail opens up the wilderness side of the Deer Creek Reservoir," said Lacey. "It's a beautiful trail, and the scenery is spectacular."

Trish Murphy, trail planner for Wasatch County, adds that the trail is open to bicyclists, pedestrians and equestrians. Visit the Heber Valley Railroad Web site at www.hebervalleyrr.org for train schedules and rates. r
